Dear Parents.

The School Council would like to inform you about our current project. We are working towards a new award called 'The Rights Respecting Schools' award (RRSA). A 'Rights Respecting School' is a community where children's rights are learned, taught, practised, respected, protected and promoted. Young people and the school community learn about children's rights by putting them into practice every day. We feel it is very important that we know our rights. Our Quaker values link closely with these expectations, particularly equality and respect.

We would like to keep you up to date with activities we are carrying out in school to help us achieve the award. All the children have completed a questionnaire to see what we already know about RRSA. We will complete the same questionnaire in a few weeks' time and compare the results.

We have also put up a new display about RRSA to inform children, members of staff and visitors to William Penn School.

We have carried out a RRSA assembly which you will be able to view on the school website shortly.

We are going to carry on raising awareness of RSSA through assemblies and lessons. We look forward to updating you soon with this project.

Prompt Arrival and Departure at School


We are asking children to take more responsibility for getting ready for school the night before. This will hopefully ease your morning routine but more importantly, will help your children to become more independent and responsible. In addition, this should make it easier for children to arrive in school on time. Where possible, we ask Years 3-6 to get to school between 8.25am and 8.35am and Years R-2 between 8.35am and 8.45am. We calculated in assembly that children arriving at 9am will miss approximately 1 ½ hours of learning a week and one whole school day a month.


