School Finances - The Governors Meet Jeremy Quin MP

On Friday of last week, members of the Governing Body met with Jeremy Quin MP to discuss the concerns of schools in West Sussex, including William Penn, regarding proposals to change school funding. Issues explored included the current proposals which will affect almost all smaller schools in the country, and certainly in the county, facing a reduced budget at a time of increased expenditure. The governors were able to give a context to the concerns in preparation for Mr Quin's forthcoming meetings with MP and ministerial colleagues.



School Finances - What Can Parents Do?

Several parents have asked whether there is anything that they can do to register their concern at proposals to reduce funding to the school. There is one very simple, quick and easy way and that is to complete a short survey which should take no more than about 5 minutes. A letter setting out the context and giving the link to the survey has been sent out by Mrs Jackson with guidance/sample answers which, if used, will make the task very straightforward. Please don't leave the survey for other parents to complete as the DfE use the volume of returns as a measure of concern as well as any comments made.
