

We have been approached by 'Bags of Support', who recycle the textiles to see if any parents would be able to co-ordinate a twice yearly collection rather than having the bin on site.





# Local Covid-19 and vaccination update – West Sussex County Council

The number of cases of Covid-19 in West Sussex remains high, so please continue to act with caution while giving consideration to today's (27 January) <u>switch to the government's Plan A</u> response to coronavirus. The Director of Public Health for West Sussex, Alison Challenger, says wearing face masks indoors and in crowded spaces, testing regularly and getting vaccinated remain effective and sensible precautions to help keep yourself and others safe.

## **Testing**

Please continue to take regular lateral flow tests to be confident you aren't spreading coronavirus.

Under current government guidance, you must self-isolate immediately <u>if you get a positive rapid lateral flow</u> result, but you will not need to take a PCR test to confirm the result.

You should continue to report positive rapid lateral flow results on the GOV.UK website.

If you have any symptoms of Covid-19, even if mild, you should get a PCR test as soon as possible.

#### **Vaccinations**

<u>Walk-in vaccination sessions</u> are available across West Sussex, or you can book an appointment in advance via the national booking system or by calling 119.

You can book <u>free travel to and from your Covid-19 vaccination appointment</u>, if you have no other means to get there, by calling Sussex Health & Care Partnership's travel coordinator on 01444 275008.

### **Schools**

The government has eased <u>guidance in schools</u>, where it is no longer compulsory to wear face coverings in classrooms.

## Please remember that this latest announcement does not signal the end of the pandemic.


Keeping schools open is a priority and we will continue to provide support as we have throughout the pandemic.


# **Pupil Achievements Outside of School**
