Textile collection to raise money for William Penn School





Safeguarding Update – Governor Monitoring

The governing body is fully committed to its safeguarding responsibilities. Our safeguarding governor recently undertook a monitoring visit in school to ensure that robust safeguarding policies and practices are in place and being adhered to. As part of the visit, she reviewed policies, training records, e-safety and talked to staff and pupils to check their understanding of how they keep themselves and each other safe.

The children talked confidently about restorative practice and their comments included:

- it's good to see the other person's point of view
- it means you can sort it out then and there

They also talked knowledgably and confidently about how they keep themselves safe online including the need to report issues to a teacher and the dangers of giving out personal details; they were all able to cite school rules relating to online safety.
