
Could you volunteer and become a school governor?

Each governor brings different experiences and skills to the role. By sharing your time and skills with us, we will provide you with training and guidance to develop this role.

Governors are required to attend 2 meetings per term, the school improvement planning day and at least 1 monitoring visit each academic year. All you need is a keen mind and a desire to ask challenging questions in the interest of improving the educational experience of our children.
