
### **Disco Reminder**

## **Ancient Ancestors Museum - Fry**

On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> December, the Year 3 and 4 children in Fry Class, at William Penn Primary opened their doors inviting in parents and pupils to their Ancient Ancestors museum. They showed

artefacts from as far back as the Stone Age, with a selection of carefully crafted replica Stonehenges. The children also showed a vast hoard of Iron Age Torcs, necklaces worn by Celtic royalty over 2,000 years





ago and a model Hill Fort. Alongside videoed news reports, the children offered bookmark making with the Celtic alphabet. Each child had taken on a role, from ticket office, expert guides, welcoming stewards and even specialist bookmark makers. The parents were very impressed by the children's historical knowledge as they talked passionately and eloquently about the various exhibits. Fry class really enjoyed showcasing all their hard work this term.

Phillipa Malins, the Curator at Cuckfield Museum who advised Fry class on how to run the museum commented: (The museum)... was all so clearly laid out – everything was to the point – I was never left wondering and your pupil guides were so able and well prepared – I felt they'd really lived the project – the diaries of children living in those times were convincing and beautifully expressed. The exhibits were varied and balanced text with objects really well I thought. The text was inviting and easy to read – single sheets nicely mounted. The news round film was beautifully made and the children looked very confident in front of the camera. Lastly, the children were so friendly and helpful to a little two year old making her book mark – they couldn't have been kinder or more patient! I thought it worked so well having an activity that could be enjoyed by all age groups - the Celtic bookmarks – I learnt something about the alphabet and those designs that you had for copying were beautiful and would be appreciated by everyone.
