Welcome to the Spring Term 2019







Staff News

Do it on paper or card no larger than A3 and no smaller than A4


Make sure you put your name, class, year group and school on the back of the poster - which must not be folded


When you need to do it by:

Updated Recycling Facilities at William Penn

We have new facilities for collection of waste resources for recycling in school. Please see the list below for an update on items that can be recycled via the school (including crisp packets and pet food packaging.)





SINGLE-USE RECYCLING SCHEME

Our public drop-off bins are at:
William Penn Primary School, Coolham,
Nr Billingshurst RH12 8GR (school hours)
Quaker Meeting House, Worthing Rd,
Horsham RH12 1SL (24/7)

In our special scheme you can recycle:

- All pet food plastic pouches (clean) and flexible plastic bags
 - Ballpoint pens, felt tips, biro, correction fluid, markers & highlighters
 - Flexible plastic from sweet biscuit, cake & cracker wrappers and crisp packets
 - Fruit & vegetable baby food pouches - Ella's Kitchen & any other brand
 - Plastic milk bottle tops - 2, 02, 4 or 04 displayed
 - Plastic air fresheners, cartridges & plastic air freshener packaging
 - Inkjet cartridges - only HP, Dell, Lexmark, Canon, Samsung, Neopost
 - Toothpaste tubes & caps, toothbrushes, heads from electric and battery toothbrushes and all associated packaging
 - Personal care & beauty products - plastic bottle caps, trigger heads, pumps, tubes, roll-on-deodorant & flexible plastic wipe packaging
 - Home cleaning products plastic bottle caps, trigger heads, pumps & cleaning wipe packaging
 - Aluminium ring pulls (can be recycled in your bin, but we collect for the Philippines)
- Other recycling accepted:**
- Laptops, notebooks, netbooks & tablets, iPads - working or broken
 - Aluminium ring pulls (can be recycled in your bin but we collect for the Philippines)
 - Mobile phones - working or broken
 - Unwanted neck ties
