"I liked screwing in the nail to the wood" George.




Thank you to the men's shed team for preparing these fantastic bird houses and teaching us how to safely use all the equipment.

Elections at William Penn

On the 4th of July, William Penn held an election day just like the rest of the UK. We could vote for 5 different parties which included the Conservative party, Labour party, Liberal Democrats, the Green party and Reform UK. Prior to this, William Penn learnt some of the main policies in the major parties such as how the Liberal Democrats want to build and safeguard a fair, free and open society. 





Announcement: We are a Rights Respecting Silver School


We are incredibly proud to announce that we have been awarded the Silver Rights Respecting School Award! After a successful morning with an external assessor from UNICEF we are excited to say that we met the standards for Silver: Rights Aware.

The external assessor was impressed by how children across the school talked about the ways in which our school facilitates the enjoyment of their rights and how they could demonstrate an understanding that rights are for all children. Children at William Penn are now able to talk freely about their rights and are aware that these rights are not earned and likewise cannot be taken away from them. They therefore do not come with responsibilities but mutual respect which informs practice and relationships in school.




The award recognises the we are now a 'Rights Aware' school and that we embed children's rights (the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child) in our school's practise and ethos. This award is granted by UNICEF UK, to schools that show commitment to promoting children's rights and encouraging adults and children to respect the rights of others. Over the past year, children and the school community have actively been finding out about their rights. It has been beneficial for children to see how their rights closely link to our Quaker Values for example, respect, equality and simplicity all interlink with the rights and our school values. This closely relates to 'Restorative Practice' that the school have implemented to encourage children to think about their rights, school values and behaviour. We will continue on our journey to embed UNICEF principles throughout the school in our policies, practice and ethos. 
Achievements Outside of School


