
"It was surprising to hear from PC Sally Scott about the consequences of the law when you are over ten." – Sophie.

PC Sally Scott's assembly was very informative and it was also great to work alongside Shipley school.




### Governor visits to classrooms


Even if you only have a small amount of time to spare, we welcome everyone to get involved. We hope to see as many of you there as possible!


### Health and Safety Reminder
