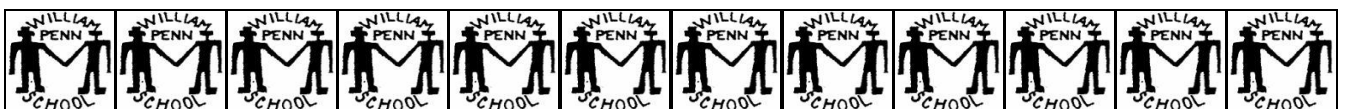
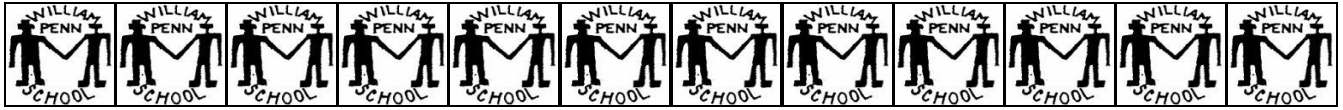

Miss Thomas writes:

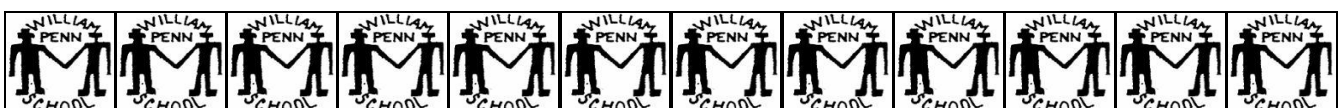

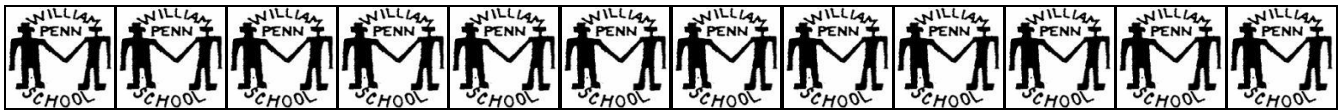


Cadbury visit Shipley Church

I will be there to meet you all and give your children their props for the parade from 10.30am. We are school number **six** and you will be able to find us by an orange or yellow star.

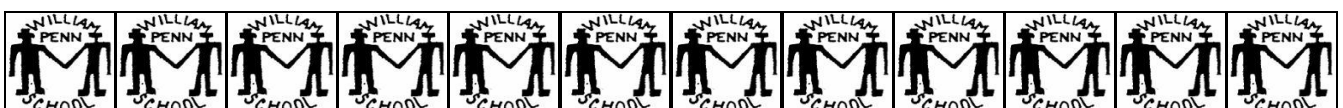
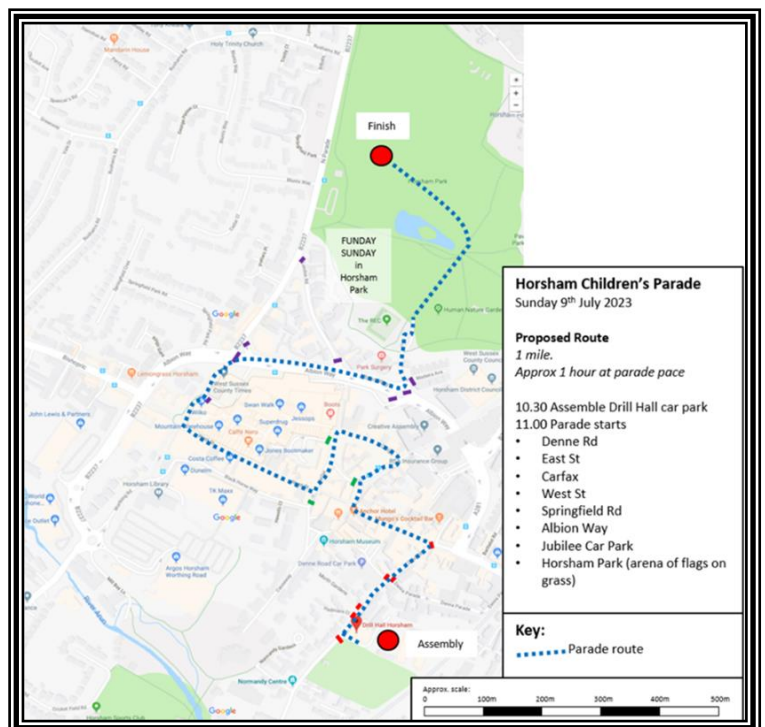

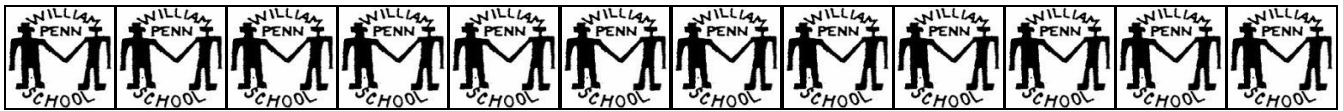
I am also attaching the parade route for the morning so you can plan where we will be walking.
