
Pond Area

On Tuesday 20th February Sussex Wildlife Trust are coming to help us make some improvements to the condition of the school pond. The two members of staff from SWT will work with JBB in the morning and Fry in the afternoon.

The practical aims for the day will be to regenerate the school pond and create a green space to benefit the students, teachers and wildlife of William Penn School. This will include;

- use nets to take out some of the pond weed
- rake out the leaf litter and some of the sediment from the pond to allow more light in





- Cut back/crown raise some of the small trees and scrub around the pond to increase light levels and reduce leaf litter falling into the pond
- Use the arising's to build a beetle bank along one edge of the wildlife area.
- Use materials on site to create brush wood revetments as additional habitat for freshwater invertebrates
- Create an amphibian hibernaculum onsite AKA a frog and toad abode.

At the start of the sessions, the SWT will introduce fresh water habitats, teach the children about the work we are doing and why we are doing it and give them an idea of what may be living in the school pond. They will demonstrate how to use any tools and make sure all work is conducted in a safe and sensible manner. Throughout the day we can have a look at any freshwater creatures we find and put them safely in holding tanks until the end of the day.

SWT will provide all tools and equipment needed for the day but recommend the children bring outdoor gear and wear old clothes which they don't mind getting wet or muddy. It would be a good idea to have a change of clothes with them and wellies if possible.
