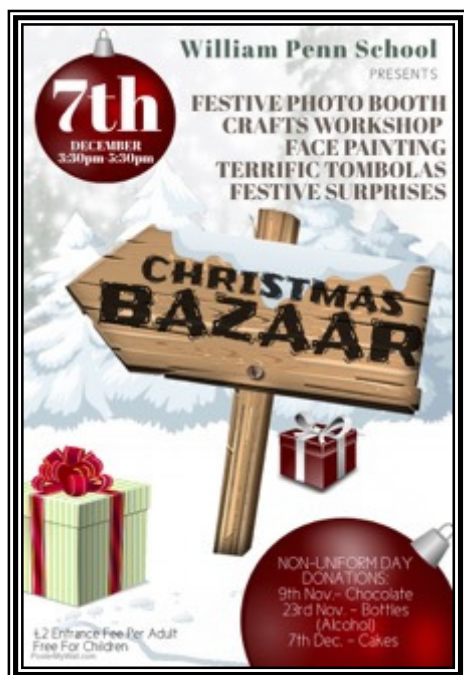

Governor News

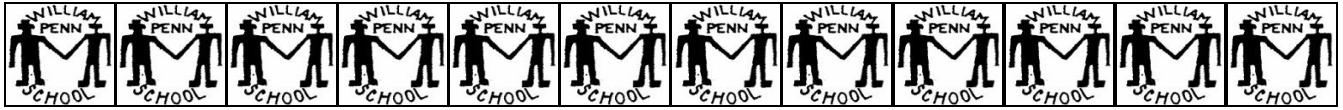

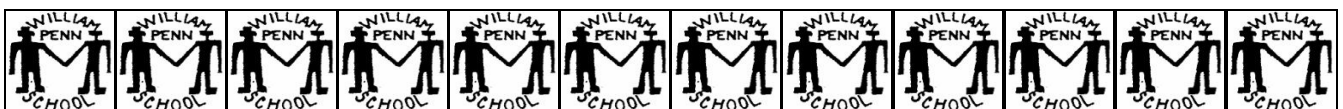


Safeguarding Update - Improvement to Pavement

Footway Reconstruction ,



What we're doing

Footway Reconstruction works will soon start on, **Billingshurst Road, Coolham.**

From Coolham Crossroads to Hillside Farm.

The work will involve the removal of the existing footpath surface and a new smooth levelled surface will be installed,

Parking restrictions will be in place during these works.

These works are subject to date changes due to inclement weather conditions, emergency works, or machinery breakdowns.



How will this affect you?

Work is expected to start **Friday 1st December** for approximately one week and the working hours will be from **9 30am to 4pm**, although we may run over by a short time occasionally to enable finishing at an earlier date.

Traffic management will be in place consisting of multiway traffic signals.

Please plan your journey in advance, and look out for important safety signs along your route. If you have any concerns regarding access during these works please ask the onsite staff, your safety is our priority.

Please arrange for any vegetation overhanging the footway from your property to be cut back before work starts. We will need clear access to the entire footway surface to complete the work, and may do this ourselves if any remaining vegetation hinders our work.
