Premises Development at William Penn - Governors' Update

Letters are being sent out this week advising of a submission of new planning permission to West Sussex County Council for our new build project, which we are pleased to announce is imminent. Our new build will now be modular in style and as such offers us greater flexibility with regards to build cost and build time; crucially the quicker build time will mean the building will benefit all of the pupils at William Penn aiming for autumn 2016. Comprising an activity/group room and classroom/s means all children will have more space in which to learn plus space for booster/enrichment sessions, music lessons, and assessments and so on. Potentially we could afford to buy a modular build offering a full size group room in addition to the smaller activity room - in order to do this we would need to raise slightly more funds.
