







Writing Competition

Free School Meals

This is a reminder that some students are entitled to free school meals. If you think your child might be eligible, please fill in the form or contact us at school for further guidance. There is a link to the form here.

If you would like help with applying please contact your child's head of house or the school office and someone will get in touch with you.

Children are eligible to receive free school meals (FSM) if their parents/carers are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working
- Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than
- **£**16,190.

The government provides additional funding to schools based on the number of students who are in receipt of Free School Meals. Therefore, by applying for FSM, you also help secure extra funding for the school which enables us to provide extra support for a wider range of students.

School Uniform Reminder for Summer Term

As we start the new term, many of you will be thinking about school uniform appropriate for the season. We have some affordable second hand uniform in stock. Please contact the school office if you would like to purchase and we will check the stock.

With regard to school uniform, we have been flexible with adherence to the policy throughout the lockdown and period afterwards. However, from the new term, the expectation is that all children are in correct uniform, as per the policy. This does mean that trainers are only worn on PE days and that PE kit should also be in line with the policy. The extract from the policy included below, gives further clarity.


Jewellerv


On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are plain gold/silver ear-ring studs in pierced ears, medical-alert bracelets or necklaces, and small objects of religious significance. The children must either remove these objects during PE and games and keep them in a safe place, or cover them with a plaster supplied from home, to prevent them from causing injury. Teachers will not look after items of jewellery and are not responsible for their safekeeping.

Hair

For reasons of safety and hygiene, all hair of shoulder length or longer should be tied back with a red, black or grey hair band.

Footwear





The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. We think that trainers are appropriate for sport or for leisurewear, but are not in keeping with the smart appearance of a school uniform. We require all children to wear shoes as stated in the uniform list.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

All items of uniform should be clearly named. The school does not keep a collection of lost property and cannot retain items of unnamed uniform.


All pupils will need one item from each box although parents may choose more.


- Grey shorts
- Grey trousers
- Grey skirt (minimum knee length)
- Grey pinafore dress (minimum knee length)
- Red and white summer dress (check or stripe and minimum knee length)
- White polo shirt (school logo optional)
- Red William Penn sweatshirt (with logo)
- Red William Penn cardigan (with logo)
- Red William Penn fleece (with logo)
- White or black PE shorts
- Red William Penn T-shirt (with logo)
- Trainers for outdoor use (Years 3,4,5 and 6)
- Track suit for outdoor, winter wear (no hoodies)
- PE bag
- Art overall (old adult shirt, optional)
- Black school shoes (not trainers or boots)
- Grey or white socks
- Grey or red tights
- No jewellery (other than plain gold/silver ear-rings studs and exceptions detailed in the Uniform Policy)
