

Nut allergies

Can we please remind you that we strive to be a nut free school. Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy, it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction; just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

School staff are trained to use the Epi-pens (an injection of adrenalin) which is required immediately if this happens. So please can we ask that you have no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school as treats.

For example:

Peanut butter sandwiches

Chocolate spreads

Cereal bars

Some granola bars

Cakes that contain nuts

Biscuits / cookies that contain nuts

Peanut butter cakes


Some Asian food, including satay

Sauces that contain nuts

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.

We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check and we know that you recognise the importance of it. I know if this was your child, you would expect that we all help, especially as it is a life-threatening condition

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff.



We have managed to achieve 93.6% attendance this year as a school.
