One of our uniform providers My Clothing are offering a 10% discount on orders placed before the end of March using code UNIFORM10%.



# Healthy snacks in school


For seven years, the Eat Them To Defeat Them campaign has been transforming the way children eat. The feedback from families is clear; consistent involvement leads to a sustained increase in vegetable consumption — over half of participating parents reporting positive lasting change. With a staggering 29% of children consuming less that one portion of vegetables daily, this program is a vital tool in improving the nation's health, one delicious vegetable at a time.

Today, we are sending home an Eat Them To Defeat Them pack with your child. This pack includes a sticker chart for the children to track how many tasty veggies they can eat over the week of the 10<sup>th</sup> of March.
